



**Kelly Fergusson, Councilmember  
City of Menlo Park  
Board of Directors  
Bay Area Water Supply & Conservation Agency**

Kelly Fergusson was appointed by the City of Menlo Park to the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency (BAWSCA). The city provides water to about 10,000 residents in two enclaves of the city, while other water purveyors serve the rest of the city's residential, commercial and industrial customers.

Fergusson was elected to a four-year term on the Menlo Park City Council in November 2004, on a platform of open government, economic development, and quality of life in residential neighborhoods, serving as Mayor in 2007. She holds three degrees from Stanford University, a PhD and MS in civil engineering and a BS in land use planning. She served as a fellow under U.S. Congressman Norm Mineta when he chaired the House Public Works and Transportation Committee, developing recommendations for the 1994 Clean Water Act amendments.

Prior to serving on the City Council, Fergusson was a Planning Commissioner for 2-1/2 years. She spearheaded the dramatic turn-around of a neighborhood commercial area that had fallen into disrepair and vacancies. Professionally, Fergusson is an expert in the growing field of geographic information systems, having chaired the 1999 California-wide professional conference and having authored an extensive list of publications and presentations. She served on a local water board from 1998 to 2004.
